“There is no reason to think that they [the police force] have finally handed over this afflicted [troubled] neighborhood to the tender mercies [brutal treatment] of an assassin, who butchers his victims almost within earshot of the street patrols.

One good result, we believe, will spring from this outbreak of crime in Whitechapel. The people of London will tolerate no longer the crutches [weaknesses] of Scotland-Yard, which sacrificed the efficiency of the preventive and detective for the sake of developing the fine military side of the police force.”
